Sewa International's Rehabilitation Plans in Association with Local Grassroots NGOs

(Released 19th January 2005)

In Tamil Nadu:

Construction of 3250 Semi Permanent Houses in 12 villages = each costing £1,500 per House.

Distribution of 3000 Fishing Nets each costing £50 per unit.

Distribution of 300 New Boats = each costing £8,750 per Boat.

Repair of 1000 Boats = each costing £1,875 per Boat.

In Kerela:

Construction of 100 Permanent Houses in one village = each costing £3,000 per house

Providing furniture and household material for 3000 houses = each costing £625.00 per house.

Construction of 8 Community Halls for Shelter during Storms/Cyclone/Floods = each costing £10,500 each

Drinking Water Project for Vypeen Island. (Costing To Be Advised)

In Andhra Pradesh:

Distribution of 1000 Fishing Nets = each costing £50 per unit

Distribution of 50 Wooden Boats = each costing £3,750 per Boat

Distribution of 100 Fibre Boats = each costing £8,750 per Boat

Distribution of 50 new engines = each costing £3,750 per Engine

Repair of 1,500 engines = each costing £250.00 per Engine

In Andaman and Nicobar Islands:

Construction of 200 Temporary Houses = each costing £1,500 per house

Repair and Reconstruction of School Buildings (Individual Costings to Be Advised depending on size and number of classrooms per school)

Pathology Laboratory (Costings to Be Advised)

Construction of 10 Community Centres = each costing £10,500 each

Construction of 4 Health Centres = each costing £12,000 each

In addition, Sewa International along with its partner NGO's will also be serving the larger needs of the victims. We will also look at funding other welfare projects such as Child Care Centres, Health Care Centres, Trauma and Counselling Centres, and Youth Clubs in some of these areas.
